

Reply to Parliament Question No 6709 for 16.12.2024 for Rajya Sabha regarding “National Logistics Policy” in respect of Numaligarh Refinery Limited (NRL):

Note for Supplementary:

Numaligarh Refinery Limited (NRL) is a Public Sector Enterprise with a 3.0 MMTPA petroleum refinery at Numaligarh in Golaghat district of Assam. Present shareholding pattern of NRL is Oil India Limited (OIL) – 69.63%, Govt. of Assam (GoA) – 26% and Engineers India Ltd (EIL) – 4.37%.

Numaligarh Refinery Limited (NRL) is not directly associated with implementation of the National Logistics Policy 2024. However, NRL has two marketing terminals – one at Numaligarh and the other at Siliguri.

Bulk of NRL's petroleum products are transported from Numaligarh to Siliguri through a pipeline of 1.721 MMTPA capacity which is owned and operated by M/s Oil India Limited. From Siliguri, NRL's products are primarily sold to M/s Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL) and such products are transported by railway rakes to various demand centres in West Bengal, Jharkhand, Odisha, Bihar and Eastern Uttar Pradesh. NRL operates a 1.0 MMTPA product pipeline from Siliguri to Parbatipur in Bangladesh through which HSD is

being pumped intermittent batches based on requirements and indents placed by M/s Bangladesh Petroleum Corporation.
