#### Highlights of NRL's performance during Q4 of FY 24-25 and FY 2024-25

(Disclaimer: All specified numbers are provisional pending finalisation of accounts for fy 2024-25)

#### **Physical Performance (Q4)**

#### **Capacity Utilization and Record Production:**

NRL's crude throughput during the fourth quarter of the year was 810 TMT. For the entire financial year, NRL achieved crude throughput of 3,066 TMT marking yet another year of over 100% capacity utilisation.

MS, Wax and Sulphur production were at an all-time high at 725 TMT, 50 TMT and 5.6 TMT respectively.

#### **Production Efficiency:**

Distillate yield during Q4 was 88.0%. while that for the full year was 86.7%. Specific Energy Consumption was 61.1 MBN for Q4 and 61.5 MBN for 2024-25 while corresponding Energy Intensity Index numbers were 79.9% and 81.1%. respectively.

#### **NREP Updates**

In the Jan-March 2025 quarter, significant achievement **▲** was recorded across various areas of the Numaligarh Refinery Expansion Project (NREP). On the engineering front, 90% model review has been completed for all process units. Major equipment required for the project have reached project site and erection is going on in full swing. Over 80% of total fabricated structural steel have been received at site, facilitating the speedy progress of structural erection and commencement of piping works. For EPCM process units, MTO-3 piping bulks (including pipes, fittings, flanges, valves) procurement have been completed for some components, while procurement action for the remaining items is in progress. Meanwhile, MTO-2 bulk piping materials receipt is nearing completion, providing sufficient fabrication front to the spooling vendor. Procurement activities for electrical and instrumentation items are progressing satisfactorily. The Satellite Rack Room (SRR4) of the CDU/VDU unit of NREP has been completed. This first major building of NREP was inaugurated by the Director (Technical), NRL in august presence of the Director (Operations), OIL.

The VDU Column with an overall height of 48.28m, diameter of 10.81m, and a weight of 635 MT has been successfully erected. Transporting this over-dimensional, over-weight consignment to Numaligarh by waterways and by road was a critical logistical achievement.

Heater package erection jobs have been completed in the DHT Unit and are progressing well in other units. 24/24 tanks erection completed, and hydrotesting successfully conducted for 23 out of 24 tanks, including three crude tanks. Furthermore, 12 out of 14 ODC/OWC have been received with 10 successfully lifted and erected. The foundation for the next ODC/OWC in sequence-Flare KOD has been completed and Hard stand preparation is in progress. The vessel has already been transported inside the NRL site and is expected to be erected in the next quarter (April 2025).

### **Marketing Highlights**

The marketing department recorded history by registering highest ever product sales in 2024-25 at 3,122 TMT surpassing the previous highest of 3,019 TMT in 2022-23. MS, Wax and Sulphur registered unprecedented sales at 707 TMT, 48.6 TMT and 5.7 TMT respectively. HSD sales was 2,030 TMT against 1,808 TMT in 2023-24. Road loading from NRMT and SMT together reached the level 1,521 TMT against previous highest of 1,492 TMT that contributed towards minimising under-recoveries. Notwithstanding political turmoil, export of diesel to Bangladesh rose to 79 TMT from 38 TMT in the previous financial year. A total of 520 POL rakes were loaded from SMT and NRMT during the financial year.

Other highlights of Marketing Function comprised renewal of Wax distributorship agreements with eight distributors and imparting candle making training at various locations including Guwahati, Khetri, Tinsukia and Silchar. Customer interaction programmes were organised in Jalandar, Patna and Bangalore.



### Advantage Assam 2.0

The Government of Assam's hosted the "Advantage Assam 2.0 – Investment and Infrastructure Summit 2025" on 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> February 2025, in Guwahati. The summit represented a significant endeavor to showcase the State's potential as a major investment destination. This global investors' summit aimed to redefine the industrial policy landscape of Assam and capitalize on its strategic location under the Act East Policy, positioning the State as a gateway to Northeast India and Southeast Asia.

Assam's economic performance has demonstrated notable progress, evidenced by a 19.5% year-on-year increase in its Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) in the fiscal year 2023. Projections for 2024-25 indicate a GSDP of ₹6,43,089 crore, representing a 13% growth over the previous year. This economic expansion has translated into tangible improvements in living standards, with the State's per capita income for 2023-24 estimated at ₹1,35,787, marking a 123% increase over the past five years.



The state government's proactive approach to attracting investments is exemplified by the establishment of a ₹25,000 crore corpus fund for Production Linked Incentives (PLI), aimed at accelerating industrialization. A prime illustration of Assam's investment potential is the

Tata Group's ₹27,000 crore semiconductor assembly and testing unit in Jagiroad, underscoring the State's capacity to attract large-scale, high-tech investments.

NRL alongwith its holding company Oil India Limited (OIL) put up an impressive stall in the Energy Pavilion in 125 sq. mtr. area to show case respective company's growth story, present performance and future initiatives.

CMD OIL & Chairman NRL, Dr. Ranjit Rath and MD NRL, Mr. B.J. Phukan were present to greet the hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi during his visit to the Energy Pavilion in late evening on 24th February. During course of the summit, NRL-OIL stall was visited by several dignitaries from India and abroad. The hon'ble Chief Minister of Assam spent nearly 20 minutes at the NRL-OIL stall interacting with officials of both companies. The first two days of the summit witnessed a footfall in the stall exceeding 3,900. In the following three days when the summit was opened to public, total footfall exceeded 6,700.

In the summit, NRL signed MoU with the Government of Assam for investment of over ₹10,700 crore in various sectors. CMD OIL & Chairman NRL and MD NRL participated in panel discussions during the technical session "Unlocking Assam's Energy Potential" which was chaired by the Hon'ble Petroleum Minister of India Shri Hardeep Singh Puri. The panel discussions also featured eminent personalities from the Oil and Gas business like Dr. Sam Algar from Cairn Vedanta, Mr. Saugat Ghosh from Matheson Hydrogen and Mr. Kaushik Rai from Adani Total Gas.

### NRL's participation in the India Energy Week 2025 at Yashobhoomi, New Delhi

The year's first major energy event, the India Energy Week 2025 (IEW 2025) was held from 11th till 14th February 2025 at Yashobhoomi Convention Centre, Dwarka in New Delhi. The event was organised under the aegis of the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas (MoP&NG), Government of India, and coordinated by the Federation of Indian Petroleum Industry (FIPI). The event brought together the full spectrum of the energy value chain-producers, consumers, innovators, and policymakers-under one roof to shape a sustainable energy future.

IEW 2025 welcomed over 70,000 energy professionals, 120+ participating countries, 700+ exhibiting companies, and 500+ speakers, including union ministers, CEOs of leading oil & gas and renewable energy companies, technology providers and start-ups. The event featured 105 technical sessions, 10 international country pavilions, and dedicated zones for hydrogen, biofuels, net zero, and start-up innovation.

The event received attendance and support from major

PSUs under MoP&NG including IOCL, ONGC, GAIL, HPCL, BPCL, EIL, OIL and NRL, where the companies showcased their flagship projects, net-zero commitments, biofuel initiatives, and green hydrogen innovations.

The event was inaugurated virtually by the hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on 12<sup>th</sup> February. Union Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas Shri Hardeep Singh Puri, addressing multiple forums throughout the energy week, highlighted India's commitment

to a just energy transition. He reiterated MoP&NG's vision for cleaner fuels, expanded LPG access, increased refining capacity, and a larger biofuels mandate. He also held bilateral meetings with global ministers and CEOs to promote investment opportunities in India's energy sector.

IEW 2025 was the first carbon-neutral global energy summit in India, certified by an independent sustainability auditor. The venue, logistics, and event design were geared towards reducing environmental footprint, supported by electric mobility options and solar-powered event zones.

IEW 2025 has firmly established India as a decisive force in shaping the global energy future - bridging traditional and new energy, economic growth and sustainability, and domestic potential with international partnerships.

During the event, MD, NRL took part in various technical discussions and addressed the gathering in the Assam Session on  $13^{\rm th}$  February.

### Support to Farmers for Pumpkin Cultivation

Through its CSR initiative, NRL has undertaken a project on pumpkin cultivation which aims to empower farmers and enhance the rural economy through sustainable pumpkin farming across 1,000 bighas of land in Golaghat district. In partnership with Krishi Vigyan Kendra, the project promotes eco-friendly practices, community-based development and the creation of green, clean villages in line with national growth goals. The project is being implemented in multiple areas including Marangi Pathar, Ponka Borchapori, Mitha Aam Chapori, Bonkual, Kuruwabarhi, Dhodang, and Difollo Pathar. The initiative has shown promising results with production of over 20 tonnes of pumpkin.







## Revival and Renovation of Wetlands of Golaghat District

NRL has initiated a CSR project to revive wetlands in Golaghat district with particular focus on Sankar Beel in Morongi area. The initiative involves extensive cleaning to remove invasive water hyacinth, thereby renovating the water body and making it suitable for scientific fish farming. On 27th March 2025, a community-centred program was organised to inaugurate the fish cultivation

project during which fish species such as Rohu, Catla, Amur Carp, Grass Carp, Silver Carp, and Mrigal were introduced. This comprehensive effort is designed to enhance environmental sustainability through ecological restoration and to boost local livelihoods by creating new opportunities in fish farming, eco-tourism, and community empowerment.

#### **MAJOR MILESTONES**

As of 31<sup>st</sup> March 2025, significant progress has been achieved on the Paradip Numaligarh Crude Pipeline (PNCPL) project. Over 1,300 km of pipeline lowering has been completed across five states: Odisha (149 km), West

Bengal (338 km), Jharkhand (123 km), Bihar (156 km), and Assam (537 km). Total 30 out of 38 major horizontal directional drilling (HDDs), 258 out of 452 minor HDDs and 19 out of 24 micro-tunnelling shaft have been completed.

#### Contribution from the editor's desk

## **Narcissism**

had a quest to learn more about narcissism, and in doing so, came across some interesting facts which I thought would be worth revealing.

Essentially, narcissism refers to the feeling and attitudes towards one's own self. It is the core of

self-esteem and emotions which influences the way one perceives and relates to others. **Psychologists** define narcissism as a pervasive pattern of grandiosity, a constant need for admiration. characterised by lack of empathy, beginning in early childhood, often lasting an entire lifetime.

A real insight about narcissism can be found in the book 'The Laws of Human Nature' where the author divides absorbed. They cannot empathise with others. To them, people are a means to an end. They survive by their need for attention from others. They are unable to withstand insult or criticism.

Functional narcissists are the vast majority of the

human populace. Most of us fall in this category. Functional narcissists have a somewhat coherent sense of self which prevents their transformation into deep narcissism. They can focus their attention outwards into constructive endeavours and relationships.

narcissists into three categories – deep narcissists, functional narcissists and healthy narcissists.

Deep narcissists are the ones we generally refer to as narcissists, and those who are completely self-

on constant validation from others. They accept their flaws and imperfections. They are not disturbed by occasional insults and criticisms. Due to the strength of their inner self, healthy narcissists can easily direct their attention outwards, showing excellence in work and building healthy relationships. Without the need of external validation, their minds are channelised towards creativity and innovations.

The concept of our 'inner-self' is central to the understanding of narcissism. Development of self is also our first effort at independence in life. Humans unconsciously create their inner-self in early childhood based on things learnt by observing their parents and experiences. We need this self to love, support and soothe us at times of need. The self is necessary to provide inner validation of our thoughts and actions.

The self that gets developed during early childhood stays with us throughout life. Psychologists offer diverse views on whether the self can be changed later in life. Many of them do agree that the inner-self can be changed to suit the needs of an individual with proper understanding and practice.

Meditation is believed to play an important role in our understanding of the self. But, for many of us, meditation is often a formidable task and a long journey. However, meditation can be practiced by anyone in a simple manner focusing on the self and then advancing progressively. It would take time, effort and discipline but eventually it opens up the path towards self-realization and understanding of the self.

Narcissism is also relative to a sense of contentment – a direct result of our internal validation. In this context, we come across an apparently paradoxical situation. One may appear as a healthy narcissist notwithstanding an inherent nature of a deep narcissist. We come across individuals of exceptional talent, epitome of creativity, innovation and who may even be a noted celebrity – clear evidence of a healthy narcissist. If such a celebrity lacks a strong self for internal validation, dependence on constant external validation becomes a compelling necessity.

Therefore, despite achievement of unparalleled success, life of such celebrities would tend to remain unfulfilled at the core. Thus, they largely remain uncontented, even manifesting rebellious and unpredictable tendencies at times.

Here it is pertinent to realise that under stimulus from intoxicants it is possible to temporarily suppress the self and experience false feeling of pleasure and elation. These are moments when a deep narcissist can get transformed into an apparent healthy narcissist. However, once the effect of stimulus wears off, the self takes over. This gives rise to the need for continuation of the false sense of good life as a matter of compulsion.

Deep narcissists suffer from a medical term called narcissistic personality disorder (NPD). The disorder is not a flaw or a character defect. It is just a health disorder. It happens for reasons that experts have not yet been able to fully comprehend. People with the disorder may not be aware of it. Often, it takes some kind of stressful event in life such as personal crisis, relationship failure, career setbacks, financial strain for the symptoms to make their appearance.

Maintaining a relationship with a narcissist is a delicate affair. The disorder can be harmful to relationships as it leads to emotional distress for those around the narcissist. It is important to remember that any attempt to make a narcissist see reason or point out their hurtful behaviour would simply be futile as they do not realise or feel that they have done anything wrong. In fact, trying to reason or argue with a narcissist can be risky as it may damage their self-image of perfection. Any message to a narcissist has to be delivered calmly, respectfully and as gently as possible.
