1.0 Introduction

Numaligarh Refinery Limited (NRL), is a Government of India Enterprise and a subsidiary of Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd. NRL operates a 3.0 MMTPA Refinery at Numaligarh in the District of Golaghat, Assam since the year 2000.

NRL is in the process of expanding its refining capacity from 3.0 MMTPA to 9.0 MMTPA, for which additional quantity of crude oil is required to be imported through Paradip Port in Odisha. To meet above requirement, a cross country pipeline of around 1630 km, shall be laid from Paradip Port in Odisha to Numaligarh for transferring 9 MMTPA of crude oil.

The crude oil pipeline shall have pipeline facilities like Sectionalizing valve Stations (SV), Intermediate Pigging Stations (IPS) and Intermediate Pumping cum Pigging Stations (IPPS) across the pipeline route covering five(5) states, namely Odisha, West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar and Assam.

2.0 Brief Scope of Work:

The complete scope of work and the basic scheme has been defined in the Technical Bid (Part-III). The bidder who undertakes to take total responsibility for the complete scope of work as defined in the Bidding document shall only be considered.

3.0 Bidder's Qualification Criteria (BQC):

- 3.1 Bidder(s) who meet all of the following criteria as specified in Clauses below shall be qualified for participating in this tender and shall submit supporting documents as detailed in the tender. Proposal submitted by bidders who qualify as per the following criteria shall be technically and commercially evaluated.
 - a) The bidder should currently be a Government Approved Valuer and should be in compliance with provision of Section 247 of the Companies Act 2013 and the Rules framed therein, i.e., Companies (Registered Valuers and Valuation) Rules, 2017 and also any other relevant Government mandated rules & regulations and any other registration requirements applicable to undertake the valuation of immovable properties. Copies of GAV registration certificate is required to be submitted, and,
 - b) The bidder should be empanelled with PSUs/ Government Departments/ Government Banks/ State Governments/ Government Autonomous bodies during last 5 years. Copies of relevant empanelment certificate shall be submitted, and,
 - c) The bidder should be in the business of land/real estate valuation at least for the last 05 (five) years. Documentary evidence in this shall be furnished, and,
 - d) The bidder should be registered with "Institution of Valuers (IOV), New Delhi" with valid Member-ID. Member ID /registration certificate shall be provided.

Non fulfillment of all the above mention Bid-Qualification criteria will lead to disqualification of bidder.

4.0 Methodology for empanelment:

- 4.1 The bidders shall be evaluated base on the BQC listed above in clause 3.0.
- 4.2 Upon successful technical qualification, the priced bid of bidders shall be opened.
- 4.3 The priced offers shall be obtained for GAV rates only based upon which the lowest bidder (L1) shall be determined.
- 4.4 The bids shall be evaluated state wise, and empanelling shall be taken up state wise.
- 4.5 The following procedure shall be considered for selection of successful bidder:
 - i). The lowest bidder (L1) shall be empanelled first. Then the counteroffer shall be made to next higher bidder to match the price quoted by L1 bidder. The counteroffers shall be made in seriatim i.e. L2, L3 & so on.
 - ii). The maximum number of GAVs empanelled per State shall be maximum three (03) and shall be based on intending bidders accepting respective state's L1 rates.
 - iii). Upon empanelment, NRL shall offer plots of land to individual GAVs based on least cost to NRL and other factors as decided by the EIC of NRL from time to time.

SPECIAL NOTE TO THE BIDDERS:

Please note that relaxation to MSE & Start-up agencies in line with Govt. circular shall not be applicable for this tender.

5.0 Documents to be submitted by bidder:

- 5.1 Bidder should submit documentary evidence to support the references provided and fulfilling the Qualifying Criteria.
- 5.2 Self-attested copies bearing seal and stamp of the Organization of all the documentary evidences as mentioned above should be uploaded electronically for the purpose of pre-qualification and technical evaluation.
- 5.3 The following are the minimum documents required:
 - 5.3.1 Relevant documents as a proof of experience (relevant work orders / contract agreement /extracts/ experience certificate from authorized officials of PSU or Government Agencies, reputed private sectors).
 - 5.3.2 The Bidder shall ensure submission of complete authentic information / documentation along with the bid.
 - 5.3.3 NRL reserves the right to directly interact with the Bidder's clients to verify the relevant documentation and the Bidder will render assistance in facilitating the same.
 - 5.3.4 All supporting documents pertaining to Bidder qualification criteria submitted by the Bidder shall be true copies, duly signed, dated and stamped by a Public Notary.
- 5.4 In absence of requisite documents, NRL reserves the right to reject the Bid without making any reference to the Bidder or assigning any reason what-so-ever.
- 5.5 All documents furnished by the bidder in support of meeting the PQC (including MSE Certificate) shall be submitted/uploaded in a separate folder titled "Documents towards PQC", duly signed and stamped by the

bidder (in case of proprietorship firm) or "Power of Attorney" holder in case of Partnership /firm/Company. Copy of such "Power of Attorney" shall also be furnished with the unpriced bid.

- 5.6 Bidders on "Holiday List of/debarred from business dealings by" NRL/Oil PSUs /MOP&NG shall not be considered for evaluation and ordering.
- 5.7 NRL decision on any matter regarding short listing of bidders shall be final.
- 5.8 Submission of authentic documents is the prime responsibility of the Bidder. However, NRL reserves the right of getting the document cross verified, at their discretion from the document issuing authority. Bidder shall also facilitate such verification/ authentication of BQC documents and in case the documents remain unauthenticated till the given timeline, NRL reserves the right to reject such bid.
- 5.9 NRL reserves the right to complete the evaluation based on the details furnished (without seeking any additional information) and / or in-house data, survey or otherwise.

6.0 Earnest Money Deposit:

- 6.1 As mentioned earlier, the bidders shall submit "Bid Security Declaration" as per format attached (Annexure B to NIT).
- **6.2** EMD exemption will be applicable only for domestic vendors/ bidders only. The same is not applicable for foreign bidders.
- 6.3 This clause shall override the respective clauses written elsewhere in the subject tender document.

7.0 Security Deposit/ Contract Performance Bank Guarantee (CPBG):

- In line with Department of Public Enterprises (DPE)'s letter no. DPE/7(4)/2017-Fin.(Part I) dated 19th Nov' 2020, the rate of contract performance bank guarantee/ security deposit is hereby reduced to 3% of the value of contract.
- 8.2 This reduction in the rate of contract performance bank guarantee/ security deposit is applicable only for domestic vendors/ bidders only. The same is not applicable for foreign bidders.
- 8.3 This clause shall override the respective clauses written elsewhere in the subject tender document.
- 8.4 The security deposit / CPBG shall be released after completion of the job in all respects.

9.0 Time Schedule:

The time schedule for completion of the job as per scope of work shall be 12 (twelve) months from the date of placement of order/LOA whichever is earlier.

10.0 Bid Validity: Validity of bid shall be 4 (Four) months from the final Bid Due Date.

11.0 TENDER DOCUMENT:

- 11.1 downloaded Tender documents should from Central Public Procurement **Portal** http://eprocure.gov.in/eprocure/app. Aspiring Bidders/ Suppliers who have not enrolled/registered in eprocurement should enroll/register before participating, through website http://eprocure.gov.in/eprocure/app . Bidders are advised to go through instructions provided as 'Instructions for online Bid Submission' provided at Appendix A to Notice Inviting Tender.
- 11.2 Bidders can access tender documents from the website, fill them with all relevant information and submit the completed tender document into electronic tender on the website http://eprocure.gov.in/eprocure/app.
- **11.3** Tenders and supporting documents should be uploaded through e-procurement portal only. Hard copy of the tender documents will not be accepted.
- 11.4 Corrigendum/addendum/extension (if any) pertaining to this tender will be published in the website only.
- 11.5 Both Technical bid and Financial bid are to be submitted concurrently, duly digitally signed in the web site http://eprocure.gov.in/eprocure/app.

Online Bids are received only on CPPP Portal website http://eprocure.gov.in/eprocure/app on or before due date as indicated in the NIT. The bidder shall be at liberty to be present either in person or through an authorized representative at the time of opening of the Technical Bid. Price Bids of only those bidders shall be opened who are Techno-commercially qualified, at a time and place for which notice shall be given. The qualified bidders shall be at liberty to be present either in person or through an authorized representative at the time of opening of the Price Bids with the Bid Acknowledgement Receipt.

12.0 GENERAL:

- **12.1** The bidders shall give a declaration that the bidder shall not be under liquidation, court receivership or similar proceeding and their business is not banned by NRL, MOPNG or any OIL PSUs.
- 12.2 The bidders who are on Holiday / Negative list of NRL as on due date of submission of bid / during the process of evaluation of the Techno commercial bids, the offers of such bidders shall not be considered for bid opening / evaluation / Award. If the bidding document were issued inadvertently / downloaded from website, offers submitted by such bidders shall also be not considered for bid opening / evaluation/ award.
- 12.3 NRL will not be responsible or liable for cost incurred in preparation, submission & delivery of bids, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.
- 12.4 In case any Bidder is found to be involved in cartel formation, his Bid will not be considered for evaluation / placement of order. Such Bidder will also be debarred from bidding in future.
- **12.5** Canvassing in any form by the Bidder or by any other agency on their behalf may lead to disqualification of their Bid.

Appendix-A

Instructions for Online Bid Submission

As per the directives of Department of Expenditure, this tender document has been published on the Central Public Procurement Portal (URL: https://eprocure.gov.in). The bidders are required to submit soft copies of their bids electronically on the CPP Portal, using valid Digital Signature Certificates. The instructions given below are meant to assist the bidders in registering on the CPP Portal, prepare their bids in accordance with the requirements and submitting their bids online on the CPP Portal.

More information useful for submitting online bids on the CPP Portal may be obtained at: https://eprocure.gov.in/eprocure/app.

REGISTRATION

- 1) Bidders are required to enroll on the e-Procurement module of the Central Public Procurement Portal (URL: https://eprocure.gov.in/eprocure/app) by clicking on the link "**Online Bidder Enrolment**" on the CPP Portal is free of charge.
- 2) As part of the enrolment process, the bidders will be required to choose a unique username and assign a password for their accounts.
- 3) Bidders are advised to register their valid email address and mobile numbers as part of the registration process. These would be used for any communication from the CPP Portal.
- 4) Upon enrolment, the bidders will be required to register their valid Digital Signature Certificate (Class II or Class III Certificates with signing key usage) issued by any Certifying Authority recognized by CCA India (e.g. Sify / TCS / nCode / eMudhra etc.), with their profile.
- 5) Only one valid DSC should be registered by a bidder. Please note that the bidders are responsible to ensure that they do not lend their DSC's to others which may lead to misuse.
- 6) Bidder then logs in to the site through the secured log-in by entering their user ID / password and the password of the DSC / e-Token.

SEARCHING FOR TENDER DOCUMENTS

- 1) There are various search options built in the CPP Portal, to facilitate bidders to search active tenders by several parameters. These parameters could include Tender ID, organization name, location, date, value, etc. There is also an option of advanced search for tenders, wherein the bidders may combine a number of search parameters such as organization name, form of contract, location, date, other keywords etc. to search for a tender published on the CPP Portal.
- 2) Once the bidders have selected the tenders they are interested in, they may download the required documents / tender schedules. These tenders can be moved to the respective 'My Tenders' folder. This would enable the CPP Portal to intimate the bidders through SMS / e-mail in case there is any corrigendum issued to the tender document.
- 3) The bidder should make a note of the unique Tender ID assigned to each tender, in case they want to obtain any clarification / help from the Helpdesk.

PREPARATION OF BIDS

- 1) Bidder should take into account any corrigendum published on the tender document before submitting their bids.
- 2) Please go through the tender advertisement and the tender document carefully to understand the documents required to be submitted as part of the bid. Please note the number of covers in which the bid documents have to be submitted, the number of documents including the names and content of each of the document that need to be submitted. Any deviations from these may lead to rejection of the bid.
- 3) Bidder, in advance, should get ready the bid documents to be submitted as indicated in the tender document / schedule and generally, they can be in PDF / XLS / RAR / DWF formats. Bid documents may be scanned with 100 dpi with black and white option.
- 4) To avoid the time and effort required in uploading the same set of standard documents which are required to be submitted as a part of every bid, a provision of uploading such standard documents (e.g. PAN card copy, annual reports, auditor certificates etc.) has been provided to the bidders. Bidders can use "My Space" area available to them to upload such documents. These documents may be directly submitted from the "My Space" area while submitting a bid, and need not be uploaded again and again. This will lead to a reduction in the time required for bid submission process.

SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- 1) Bidder should log into the site well in advance for bid submission so that he/she upload the bid in time i.e. on or before the bid submission time. Bidder will be responsible for any delay due to other issues.
- 2) The bidder has to digitally sign and upload the required bid documents one by one as indicated in the tender document.
- 3) Bidders are requested to note that they should necessarily submit their financial bids in the format provided and no other format is acceptable. If the priced bid have been given as a standard BOQ format with the tender document, then the same is to be downloaded and to be filled by all the bidders. Bidders are required to download the BOQ file, open it and complete the white colored (unprotected) cells with their respective financial quotes and other details (such as name of the bidder). No other cells should be changed. Once the details have been completed, the bidder should save it and submit it online, without changing the filename. If the BOQ file is found to be modified by the bidder, the bid will be rejected.
- 4) The server time (which is displayed on the bidders' dashboard) will be considered as the standard time for referencing the deadlines for submission of the bids by the bidders, opening of bids etc. The bidders should follow this time during bid submission.
- 5) All the documents being submitted by the bidders would be encrypted using PKI encryption techniques to ensure the secrecy of the data. The data entered cannot be viewed by unauthorized persons until the time of bid opening. The confidentiality of the bids is maintained using the secured Socket Layer 128 bit encryption technology. Data storage encryption of sensitive fields is done
- 6) The uploaded tender documents become readable only after the tender opening by the authorized bid openers.
- 7) Upon the successful and timely submission of bids, the portal will give a successful bid submission message & a bid summary will be displayed with the bid no. and the date & time of submission of the bid with all other relevant details.
- 8) The bid summary has to be printed and kept as an acknowledgement of the submission of the bid. This acknowledgement may be used as an entry pass for any bid opening meetings.

Special Instructions to the Bidders for the e-submission of the bids online through e-Procurement Portal:

- Bidder should do Online Enrolment in this Portal using the option Click Here to enrol available in the Home Page. Then the Digital Signature enrolment has to be done with the e-token, after logging into the portal. The e-token may be obtained from one of the authorized Certifying Authorities such as eMudhraCA/GNFC/IDRBT /MTNLTrustline/SafeScrpt/TCS.
- Bidder then logs into the portal giving user id / password chosen during enrolment.
- The e-token that is registered should be used by the bidder and should not be misused by others.
- DSC once mapped to an account cannot be remapped to any other account. It can only be Inactivated.
- The Bidders can update well in advance, the documents such as certificates, purchase order details etc., under
 My Documents option and these can be selected as per tender requirements and then attached along with bid
 documents during bid submission. This will ensure lesser upload of bid documents.
- After downloading / getting the tender schedules, the Bidder should go through them carefully and then submit the documents as per the tender document, otherwise, the bid will be rejected.
- The BOQ template must not be modified/replaced by the bidder and the same should be uploaded after filling the relevant columns, else the bidder is liable to be rejected for that tender. Bidders are allowed to enter the Bidder Name and Values only.

that the clarity is maintained and also the size of file also gets reduced. This will help in quick uploading even at very low bandwidth speeds.

- It is important to note that, the bidder has to Click on the Freeze Bid Button, to ensure that he/she completes the Bid Submission Process. Bids which are not Frozen are considered as Incomplete/Invalid bids and are not considered for evaluation purposes.
- In case of Offline payments, the details of the Earnest Money Deposit(EMD) document submitted physically to the Department and the scanned copies furnished at the time of bid submission online should be the same otherwise the Tender will be summarily rejected
- The **Tender Inviting Authority (TIA)** will not be held responsible for any sort of delay or the difficulties faced during the submission of bids online by the bidders due to local issues.
- The bidder may submit the bid documents online mode only, through this portal. Offline documents will not be handled through this system.
- At the time of freezing the bid, the e-Procurement system will give a successful bid updating message after uploading all the bid documents submitted and then a bid summary will be shown with the bid no, date & time of submission of the bid with all other relevant details. The documents submitted by the bidders will be digitally signed using the e-token of the bidder and then submitted.
- After the bid submission, the bid summary has to be printed and kept as an acknowledgement as a token of the submission of the bid. The bid summary will act as a proof of bid submission for a tender floated and will also act as an entry point to participate in the bid opening event.
- Successful bid submission from the system means, the bids as uploaded by the bidder is received and stored in the system. System does not certify for its correctness.
- The bidder should see that the bid documents submitted should be free from virus and if the documents could not be opened, due to virus, during tender opening, the bid is liable to be rejected
- The time that is displayed from the server clock at the top of the tender Portal, will be valid for all actions of requesting bid submission, bid opening etc., in the e-Procurement portal. The Time followed in this portal is as per Indian Standard Time (IST) which is GMT+5:30. The bidders should adhere to this time during bid submission.
- All the data being entered by the bidders would be encrypted at the client end, and the software uses PKI encryption techniques to ensure the secrecy of the data. The data entered will not be viewable by unauthorized persons during bid submission and not viewable by any one until the time of bid opening. Overall, the submitted bid documents become readable only after the tender opening by the authorized individual.
- During transmission of bid document, the confidentiality of the bids is maintained since the data is transferred over secured Socket Layer (SSL) with 256 bit encryption technology. Data encryption of sensitive fields is also done.
