

Reply to Parliament Question No 8940 for 10.08.2023 for Lok Sabha regarding “Vapour Recovery System at Petrol Pumps” in respect of Numaligarh Refinery Limited (NRL):

Q no. (a): whether the Government has taken cognizance of the air pollution caused by the petrol vapor containing volatile compound benzene released from vehicles / tanks during released from vehicles / tanks during refueling;
